The lights will dim as dramatic readings of Poe's major works, including "The Raven" and "The Tell-Tale Heart," are chillingly delivered to a captivated audience by state officials and other community members. Drama students from Canandaigua Academy will play Poe's characters—Fortunato, Roderick Usher, and Prince Prospero. Poe himself will make an appearance. Guests will be challenged to guess the characters and Poe's stories or poems. Costumes will be judged and prizes awarded. Teens and adults are invited to this ticketed, catered event.
